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
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Dear Parents,

Do you believe your child can read English at a very early stage? Yes, it is possible. As a parent, one of the most important and exciting moments is seeing your child do well academically. The ability to read is one key stepping stone on this path. To make your child a good reader without any aid, Phonics is the right method. It will happen when Phonics are taught them correctly.

What is Phonics?

Phonics is a skillful method of teaching children to read by identifying and linking sounds, that each letter makes. It teaches children the relationship between sounds and letters. It helps them learn to decode unfamiliar words in English, so they can read with greater fluency. In the English language, each letter has its unique sound. By blending them, children can create words that form the very foundation of learning. It also helps them understand the structure of written language including word formation and spelling. This is the world of phonics, and it is a vital part of early childhood education.

Benefits of Learning Phonics:

- Recognition of letters and sounds.
- Identifying the sounds that combinations of letters make.
- Blending sounds to create new words.
- Spelling of the words.
- · Formation of words.
- · Reading becomes faster.


What is CVC?

CVC is the blending of a consonant–vowel–consonant pattern. CVC words are the first words that children learn to read by segmenting and blending three phonemes that make up the CVC words.

Parents/ Teachers Guidelines:

- 1. At first take a common pattern or word family (such as:'ab'). Now add a new consonant before the word patterns and practice sounding out the letters in segments. For an example: $Cab = \frac{c}{-a}$.
- 2. Blend the initial consonant with word families. Ask your child/student to sound out the first consonant of the word and then blend this sound with the word families. Now let the child say the word as a whole. Such as: /c/+ /ab/= cab.
- 3. Ask children to say words with the same ending sounds. For an example: /d/+/ab/=dab, /g/+/ab/=gab etc.
- 4. Let the children practice with short vowel sounds.
